


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

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A NOTE FROM DIRECTOR PETER ROTHSTEIN

I read an early draft of Come from Away back in 2013, four years before it landed on Broadway. While the idea of a musical about 9/11 may have seemed absurd. I was an immediate fan. For me, the essential ingredient for any musical is that the story must have a big heart, and Come from Away is all about heart, about our unique ability as human beings to exercise compassion. It is an honor to tell this story as we approach the 25th anniversary of September 11th, 2001, "To honor what was lost but to also commemorate what we found."

The first unplanned closure of U.S. airspace in the nation's history happened at 9:42 a.m. on that crisp, clear Tuesday morning. There were 4,546 planes in the air at the time, all scrambling to find a place to land. 38 of those planes, carrying roughly 7,500 passengers, landed in Gander, Newfoundland, nearly doubling the town's population.

One of the many things I admire about this musical is how the writers Irene Sankoff and David Hein chose to have the actors play multiple characters. Each actor portrays a local (a Newfie) and a foreigner (a 'come from away') because as the writers state, "All of us at some point in our lives will be in desperate

need of help and will also be in a position to help someone in desperate need."

In that light, Come from Away is a perfect story for this sacred time of year. For me, the story of Christmas is a story of hospitality: after being turned away, two strangers are welcomed into the most humble of dwellings, but despite their modest surroundings something miraculous happens.

Tonight, we honor what was lost, But we also commemorate what we found!

I've spent a good deal of time reading testimonies about those five days in Newfoundland, when thousands of strangers were welcomed into rather humble dwellings, and something miraculous happened. Their hosts however, didn't consider it a miracle, "It's just what you do. You help each other in times of need. It's the Newfie way."

At this time of year Jewish people light a menorah for eight consecutive nights during the Festival of Hanukkah. This

tradition commemorates the miracle of the lamp, when their ancestors found only one small jar of pure olive oil, enough to light the Temple menorah for a single day. However, this small amount of oil miraculously burned for eight nights. How did a town of 10,000 people find food and lodging for 7,500 people, shining a light so brightly in one of the darkest of times?

The Festival of Kwanza lasts for a week, each day celebrating one of the festival's core principles. One of those principles is Ujima, a Swahili word meaning: collective work and responsibility; to create community, to make our sisters' and brothers' problems our problems. Another core principle is Kuumba, meaning to do as much as we can, with whatever means we have, to leave our community more beautiful, more bountiful than we inherited it. The direct translation of the word Kuumba is Creativity, which leads me to the work we do as theatre artists. I believe it is our charge to shine a light on the best of humanity, and in turn inspire a more compassionate, a more hopeful world. Thank you for being here.

This holiday season, may you be surrounded by your loved ones, and may you extend that love to the strangers who surround you.

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
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VOICES FROM OUR COMMUNITY

Principal of Emma E. Booker Elementary school on Sept 11, 2001 Sarasota

Curated quote from her book: "The 9/11 Principal"

"With my own eyes I witnessed something. 'What?' I wasn't quite sure of, but it didn't follow any briefing I had received. No place in the script said that Andrew Card would walk in front of me in the second-grade classroom and whisper something to the President. He heard something and

he bit the ends of his lip, just where the mouth curls up on the ends. He leaned over, picked up the book, "The Pet Goat," and followed the children as they read the story. When the last child read the words, "to be continued," the President's response was, "What does it mean 'to be continued'?"

"How can we argue that America was not better for the moment? We were strong for the moment, scared, but brave."

responded rather reacted. I know he went somewhere for a brief moment and returned. He returned stronger and confident. For just a moment A child answered, "It means there is more to come." "That's right," both the teacher and the President responded.

Yes, a horrific thing occurred, but let's look at what the [attackers] wanted to have happen. They wanted America to be stunned. They wanted to cripple America, and they wanted to see fear on the face of the President. It didn't happen. How can we argue that America was not better for the moment? We were strong for the moment, scared, but brave. Our school will never be the same, as a country our lives will never be the same, and as a people, I hope to God we will change. This is our chance. Let us seize this opportunity. Let us return to the foundation, the very roots and principles this country was established under."

"On 9/11 I was a reporter at ABC 7, WWSB-TV in Sarasota. President Bush was coming to Sarasota that day to promote reading. Because we were from the local station, videographer Devin Marshall and I were selected to be in the second-grade classroom with the President as he read with the students. ABC network reporter Ann Compton and her videographer were chosen to represent the networks. We had to be in the room at 5 am

now", and as we followed at his heels, he then announced to the world that our country was under attack. That was the first I realized what was going on. I instantly grabbed the hand of the person on either side of me and felt a surge of pride and love for my country and the people in my country that I had never felt before. I felt no fear. Just a feeling of strength, confidence and pride, and an absolute certainty that together, we Americans could

that morning and were asked to hand over our cell phones. So, we had no idea what was going on. The President came in some time later. He sat down and the children began to read. I was just a few feet away from the President. Not long after, Chief of Staff Andrew Card came into the room and whispered something in the President's ear. The President let the child who was reading finish. Then he started walking toward the door. Ann Compton, who must have had two cell phones - one she didn't hand over - said, "Mr. President, do you know a second plane just hit the World Trade Center?" The President said, "We are going to deal with that right face whatever we had to face, and come through victorious.

After a short speech, the secret service rushed the President out of the school to the airport and Air Force One took off immediately, leaving all but a handful of the National and International media behind here in Sarasota. All planes were grounded, so those left behind were scrambling so they could follow the President. Some were stuck here for days. In the following days I felt a new bonding with the people around me, and a deep love for my country and my fellow Americans I had never felt before. That tragic day brought Americans together as nothing had in my experience."

My two sons and I had completed a 12-day golfing trip all around Ireland as we boarded Delta flight 129 bound for Atlanta (we thought) connecting on to home in Sarasota. Our brand new Boeing 767 was full, mostly American tourists heading home and Irish families headed for Disney World on vacation. Our crew were seasoned old timers on that route and the captain was commanding his final flight

after a long and distinguished career. Surprise for all—halfway across the Atlantic, our plane was diverted to Newfoundland.

We were the last international flight to land at Gander that day. That put us at the end of a very long line for everything instant. Boy, did the Newfies handle it well.


The townspeople fed us, bedded us, took us into their homes and social clubs, entertained us, cared for our needs, and would not take a dime from us. The only thing

-the food and water truck, the bathroom emptying truck, the information dissemination about the terrorist attacks in the U.S., the Mountie visits to the plane, and after 24 hours locked tight on the ground, at last the wheeled exit ramp that barely reached the door. Off we went with carry-ons only by school bus for 70 miles to the tiny fishing town of Lewisporte to spend three days and nights. Three plane loads of strangers who had "Come from Away" suddenly grew that town's population by a third in an

we paid for was beer at the two main street taverns, which both ran dry for a while. We even drank the rum and kissed the cod as they "screeched" us in as honorary Newfies—what an honor. We will never again meet people as hospitable and friendly as our emergency hosts in Newfoundland. I thank them again every chance I get.

There is no way I can ever fully thank the Salvation Army members, the Canadian Red Cross and the Canadians for their compassionate care of all of us."

Sarasota, On September 11, 2001: A fifth grader at Emma E Booker Elementary

Standing behind one of the most powerful men in the world at 10 years old as an eyewitness to history shaped how a small moment can become historic and part of a legacy. On one side of the country, we were having our nation's epicenter and various landmarks attacked. Then all the way down in Sarasota in what felt like a small town we were hosting a President celebrating kids at Emma E. Booker for excelling in education. A victory which would be superseded by tragedy but united us in solidarity. I remember it felt like almost overnight the world changed from the way we traveled to handling security and defense measures. With the Internet in its infant stages,

I was able to research the past. read and watch former stories around the world in the present and try to piece together for myself what led up to a day that I will not outlive. Over the last several decades, I have had the opportunity to meet soldiers, policemen, politicians, FBI agents, training pilots, and countless reporters. Chance brought us together, but we share a common connection all tied to one fateful day. With timelines so closely linked yet locations so far apart it's been with great honor, pride, and respect to be able to reflect on the world's stage to share my thoughts and experiences and continue to be an advocate for education as well as a united America.

On 9/11, I was working at our local blood bank on Mound Street as an Education Specialist. I had just finished our annual employee training when two people burst in the room and shouted, "A plane just hit the World Trade Center and caused a tower to collapse!" We couldn't believe what we were hearing as we hurried downstairs to the donor room to watch the TV hanging from the wall. With horror and awe, we saw the second tower collapse and were speechless. Within 45 minutes blood

Within 45 minutes blood donors started appearing at the front door to our building. Fifteen minutes later the front lobby was filled with donors clamoring to donate blood. President Bush was on air urging people to go and donate blood. Soon our parking lot was

swamped with cars. Potential donors were lined up out the door and down the street. Volunteers were directing

traffic. Employees stepped up to the plate, screening donors and drawing blood. Lab employees processed and tested the blood, ensuring its safety. Local restaurants sent food to feed everyone. On 9/11 I was an active fire captain with the North Hudson Regional Fire and Rescue Department in North Jersey. I remember speaking on my phone with a fellow firefighter watching the north tower burning and thinking "Wow these guys in New York are going to bust their butts going up the stairs." Then the second plane hit the south tower. I'm thinking now something is not right here.

The next day we were deployed (all volunteers). My job was to

keep my guys together and safe. I remember going through the empty Lincoln Tunnel and then being cheered on by everyone on Westside Hwy.

At Ground Zero we went to "the well" with buckets to help remove the debris. There were people from all over the United States including construction workers (the unsung heroes). They were so respectful to all the firefighters and police. As it turned out there were just too many people and it started getting too dangerous, steel beams flying around, cranes moving back and forth and myself ducking from the moving

beams, the debris was over 100 feet high. I know of all of the firefighters that were there, it wasn't because they had to be, it was because they wanted to be. We will never forget the firefighters, Port Authority and New York policemen, plus the civilians that that lost their lives that day.


